- 1. IDENTIFICATION Dispatchers, yardmasters, and engineers transmitting or acknowledging a radio transmission begins with the essential identification:
 - Dispatcher Dispatcher to _____ Examples:
 - *"Dispatcher to train 212"*
 - "Dispatcher to K Falls Yardmaster"
 - Yardmaster <u>(Yard name)</u> Yardmaster to _____ Example:
 - "Coos Bay Yardmaster to train 251"
 - Train Engineers –*Train (number or name) to* _____ Examples:
 - "Coos Bay Hauler to K Falls Yardmaster"
 - "Train 271 to Dispatcher"
 - *"SP4449 east to Dispatcher"*
- 2. **REPITITION** Any engineer receiving a transmission must repeat it to the transmitting party except when the communication:
 - Relates to switching operations.
 - Is a recorded or automated message from an alarm device (i.e., hotbox detector).
 - Is general in nature and does not contain any information, instructions or advice which could affect the operation of the train.
- **3.** Use of "OVER" To indicate to the receiving person the transmission has ended and a response is expected, the transmitting person says the word "OVER".
- 4. Use of "OUT"- To indicate to the receiving person the exchange of the transmissions is complete and no response is expected, the transmitting person states his or her identification (i.e., Dispatcher, Yardmaster, Train ____) followed by the word, "OUT".

***Guest Use of CMRM Radios: The use of operations radios is for CMRM volunteers only. If a guest would like to listen in on the transmissions of operations they can request a "Guest Radio" for their use.
